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DAY 1: DO WHAT YOU ARE CALLED TO DO!

"Do not despise the day of small beginnings." Zechariah 4:10

In the 1980s one evening at a church leaders' meeting, the pastor gave direction to all the church leaders to seek the Lord as to His role for each couple in the Body of Christ.

Myrna diligently fasted, prayed and read God's word seeking the Lord to hear from Him, but due to work and other matters, I was unable to do so right then. After three days of seeking God, Myrna declared that the Lord had shown her, but she'd wait until I personally heard from Him. We knew that what He'd say to one He'd confirm it with the other. So, I walked into the garage,

prayed and came back into the house after five minutes saying, "Okay. I know."

Unbelieving, Myrna inquired with a smirk, "So, God answered in 5 minutes?" I could tell she thought I was going to give her an off the wall answer, but I solemnly replied, "Watchman!" With a shocked look Myrna meekly replied, "You really did hear in five minutes. 'Watchman' is what He said to me, too."

Humbly we both knew that the Lord had confirmed our calling and would have us on the wall to watch, pray and sound the alarm. We "saw" and continue to "see" the world's evil condition, the spiritual state of people, the apathetic and complacent condition of many Christians in not reaching out to others with the love of Jesus Christ nor sharing the Good News. And God revealed how to turn those negatives we "see" into His positive solutions.

In 1985 our pastor asked us to help start an educator's ministry which confirmed what God had already shown us. Therefore, for the next 36 years we equipped Christian educators on how to live their faith at school (educator to educator). Over 2000 educators received Christ as Savior. Then the Lord expanded our vision to see beyond just educators, but to everyone everywhere. In 2022 the Lord had ordinary people share their stories about what an extraordinary God had done in their lives. That turned into the gospel tool, GOD STORIES And More booklets, with Christians giving them to others and asking God to change the recipients' lives. In five months, 11,000 booklets were distributed in the USA, Kenya, Mexico, Japan, South Korea. The booklets were translated to Spanish. In addition, Ron Corzine from Fort Worth, Texas joined the team for the social media aspect to help reach others worldwide with the love of Jesus Christ. DAY 2: SHE MADE A BELIEVER OUT OF ME.

This story begins when I was a nine-year-old boy attending Sunday School and Training Union at a

I laughed like Sarah when she was told she would have a

child in her old age. Under my breath not understanding the proper phrase, I said, "Over your dead body."

Well, my life continued seemingly on course. I was living fast and furious as a teenager, doing my own thing and giving no thought to my future. On my 18th birthday, I was invited to a citywide crusade. That night as the minister spoke, my heart was touched as I was faced with the reality of my life, how I was living it, and what I would do to make a difference in this world. Having forgotten what Mrs. McGuffee had spoken years earlier, I went forward at the end of the service and committed my life to do God's will. I later discovered it was God's will for me to be a preacher of the gospel. And here I am today.

I think it is ironic that many years later I received a call from Mrs. McGuffee's family. They said that she had just gone to be with the Lord and that she had requested that I do the funeral service. Because of her influence and the impact she had made in my life, I accepted. On that day at a church in Howe, Texas, I stood and told the above story to those gathered in her remembrance. "Today, I stand here over her dead body as a fulfillment of what she spoke over me many years ago as small boy." I then proceeded with my eulogy.

So, when people speak positive things concerning your life that you cannot explain or understand, do not despise them or their words. It could just be the Lord speaking to you through them about your future.

It was over two years after the start of the covid pandemic that I was finally infected. My primary care doctor would continually ask me why I wouldn't take the "experimental jab." I told him because I didn't want to and I believed that God had ordained my days and that I wouldn't die a day before, or live a day longer than the days ordained for me by the Lord. He couldn't understand that and told me that I was in the highest risk group —BP, pre-diabetes, over 65, plus I didn't wear a mask religiously.

When I got sick, he told me not to worry because the virus' effect was more dangerous and destructive on the

body of people who were fearful. I told him that I had the peace of God and would trust the Lord and his wisdom to get me through. I contracted covid with pneumonia. He treated me and I was over the virus in less than a week. However, the residue that covid left on my lungs was a challenge. I found that I couldn't breathe normally without labored breathing. He put me on oxygen immediately and told me that my cells needed to heal.

The nights and early morning prayer times that I experienced with the Lord (I had trouble sleeping), were life-changing. Even though I wasn't sleeping normally, I felt energized as I spent time speaking to the Lord in the early hours of the morning.

One day, during my prayer and worship time with the Lord (on my oxygen machine), I told the Lord that I believed He had the power to heal me instantly. I said, "Lord, you can heal me right now, by the dawn of the morning, I can put this oxygen aside and breathe normally. I believe you are powerful to do it now!" The Lord's reply came to me in the form of a question to my heart: "What if I don't do it immediately? What will you do then?" I was stunned. I was certain that I would hear the Lord's commendation — "I have not found so great a faith ..." As I contemplated the question I wasn't expecting, I replied to the Lord that I would still worship and praise Him no matter what. Then the Lord challenged me. "What if I have something else I want to do for you before healing your body?" I knew the Lord was up to something greater than a physical healing. He then said, "You are a very impatient man." As I heard those words in my heart, I was undone. I knew the Lord wanted to finally deal with a very real issue in my heart —impatience!

The Lord unmasked what I thought was faith and showed me my impatience even in my prayer to Him: "Lord, you can heal me RIGHT NOW!" I knew the Lord was calling me to repentance for my arrogant, impatient, demanding spirit. All I could do was simply lie prostrate before the Lord early one morning and confess my sin and said to Him, "do what you must do in me, Lord, even if my physical healing delays. I will wait for you as long as it takes." The Lord worked marvelously in my heart and I was led to genuinely ask my wife for forgiveness for my impatience with her! It was a few weeks after that that I came to a full recovery in my lungs and returned to normal breathing with no lingering effects from the virus.

The Lord had taken me through the journey of healing and wholeness. I encourage you to trust in the Lord, today, with all your heart and let Him truly be Lord over all of your life and you will find greater riches from His wisdom, mercy and grace.

That evening our family went to Wednesday night Bible Study. My pastor met us at the front door of the church building and said, "This afternoon my son called me

DAY 10: SEVEN KINDS OF PEOPLE IT IS HARD TO HELP

The Lamaze class was just ending when the teacher made a few final suggestions. "Now, ladies, let's not forget to exercise right up to the end," she said. "Walking is especially good for you because it strengthens pelvic muscles and will help to make the delivery much easier." She went on to say, "And remember husbands, that we are in this together with our wives, so it

would be beneficial if you walked with them." As everyone was leaving, the instructor saw a younger man raise his hand in the back. "Yes, sir?" she asked. "I wondered if it's alright if she carries my golf clubs while we are walking?"

After many years in ministry, I have seen that people's motives and character quickly find the surface. Most leaders can pick up on self-awareness, jealousy, laziness, integrity, and honor during the briefest of conversations. And like the young, soon-to-be father, our ulterior motives can come out of us so fast that we rarely catch it until it's too late.

One of my greatest joys is seeing men and women receive wisdom and instruction and use it to bring about real change. We live in a world that expounds the idea that we cannot be different. And it is that mindset that even keeps us trapped in a body that we do not like. But change can and does happen in some people every day. On the other side of that coin is one of my biggest frustrations. It is hard to watch some people who have all the talent, skill, and potential waste it because they would not grow, develop and change. I have seen it so many times it makes me sick. In fact, early on, when mentoring or teaching someone, I can recognize issues that make it almost impossible to help them until they own that part of their character. Perhaps in trying to help others, you too have identified those traits. Maybe you have seen some in your own life. Let's look at seven people who are hard to help in either case.

1. It's hard to help people who won't separate from the wrong people.

Changing can be challenging, but trying to change big things in your life while staying plugged into the wrong crowd never works. I talked to a recovering alcoholic once about his journey out of drinking. I have never struggled with alcohol, so I was curious about how he had made a change that had lasted over 20 years. He told me that it was hard at first because his friends and family were the patrons of a local bar. He said, "I was fine with not drinking, but I didn't realize that I didn't fit in anymore without drinking." He had several relapses

trying to hang out there while remaining sober. The change happened when

he realized that he had to find a whole new community of friends. He made some at AA, a gym, and a church he started to attend. After that, his journey to recovery was much easier. If people cannot have the courage to walk away from the friends who are "kindly" hijacking their lives, then there is a tiny chance they will make different decisions

2. It's hard to help people who can't respect proven achievers.

In my experience, God uses us all as road maps for others. For some, we serve as a warning. For others, inspiration on how to navigate specific issues and problems. Some people become so irked with their lot in life that they build walls against other people's successes. They can hear a story of someone who overcame the exact same obstacle they have and then dismisses them as having "got lucky." When a man cannot look up to anyone, it is an issue of pride. I used to believe that only the successful and wealthy struggle with pride. I have since learned that pride is not a respecter of gender, status, or nationality. Pride becomes the warden, never allowing them to follow another out of their trap.

3. It's hard to help a person who only wants your resources and not your wisdom.

There are reasons people get into messes in their life. And although there are times that they had no fault in it, they could have avoided it more often than not. So, when people ask for my help, I always like to see if, along with my resources, they would like some instruction and wisdom. It is my great joy to help; however, when I sense that they just need me for what is in my pocketbook, I realize that my help will only serve as a Band-Aid on a gaping wound. A person who refuses to seek wisdom before resources often live the life of a victim their entire life.

4. It's hard to help people who have never been broken.

When we are young, we see failures as our worst enemies. We avoid them at all costs, and when they hit our lives, we try to spin the story, so it really wasn't our failure. However, as we get older, many of us start to see failures in our life as defining moments and some of the greatest times of learning. We may never love them, but we do see them more as a needed slap in the face to give us a clearer vision. A person who cannot own a failure or has ever felt the sting of being broken is often too detached from reality to understand a change on their part is needed. We can only watch and wait for people like this until God interrupts their world and brings them crashing to their knees.

5. It's hard to help someone who blames you for their issues.

I have seen this a lot with children. Kids leave home, and then life hits them in the nose. The next thing you know, they blame the parents for not hugging them enough or hugging them too much. Maybe their bedtime was too early, or perhaps you did not fill the encouragement quota. I have watched parents feel like trolls because a twenty-something know-it-all is playing psychologist in everyone's life. As this unfolds, parents often try to step it up more and fix things.

All this does is give the child more things to rant about. Until they stop blaming the parent, the parent cannot really help. Life is not a fair place. In fact, it can be downright hurtful. No one leaves home 100% ready for what is coming. But when people stop blaming others and choose to resist bitterness, they can position themselves for receiving help. If someone blames or accuses me for their lot in life, I am the last person who will fix them. I cannot care more about your life than you do.

6. It's hard to help a "Know-It-All."

Not much to say here. We all have had people who needed our help, but in the end, they wanted to teach us how to help them out of their mess because they are the authority on it. It makes NO SENSE AT ALL! When they show up in my life, I simply smile and understand I am not needed. They have it all covered...or at least they think they do.

7. It's hard to help people who don't understand responsibility.

The word responsibility means "able to respond." When a man or woman cannot take the burden on their shoulders, helping them becomes an exercise in futility. Odds are, they will always get bogged down in the mud of fault. Not everything we go through is our fault, but it is still our responsibility. I know a man who got a very rare sickness. He did nothing to bring it on himself, and doctors do not know what caused it. He said he felt sorry for himself for the first week and pouted while being hospitalized. Finally, his doctor told him that a bad attitude would kill him faster if he didn't take personal responsibility for fighting this illness. Her words were enough to snap him out of it. Within a week, he had made enormous improvements. Only those who take responsibility will change things that must be changed.

I have spent my life encouraging others and helping people reach their dreams. I have also spent countless hours scratching my head and wondering why some won't become all they could be. In training leaders, you get a front-row view of growth's cause and effect. It never gets old. You will also encounter moments when only God can intervene and put one's life in order. If you can recognize it early, it can save you time and frustration.

WHERE DOES MY HELP COME FROM?



When things look down, just look up. "I lift up my eyes to the hills--where does my help come from? My help comes from the LORD." Psalm 121:1-2

Psalm 121 is all about God's protection on whatever journey in life that we are on. It is a short psalm and one that is worth praying for frequently. It will encourage and strengthen your heart.

DAY 11: HE KNEW HOW TO FORGIVE

Unforgiveness is like drinking poison and expecting the other person to die.

My dad was the most forgiving person I have ever known.

Maybe that is why he whistled and smiled all the time.

I can remember as a small boy watching as church leaders would knock on our front door and invite my dad outside for a talk. A little while later he would return and mom would ask, "Do we have to move again?"

You see dad was a pastor of small country churches. He loved people and was faithful in helping them any way he could. But he also refused to compromise; therefore, he spoke the truth in love. The problem it seems was most people loved their ways more than God's Word. So, dad would occasionally hit a nerve and they would respond. But with God's help he would forgive quickly and

move on.

Forgiveness. It can be such a hard thing to do, but it is liberating to the soul. What makes it difficult for most people to do, is the way we define it. We think of forgiveness as meaning that we should say all is forgotten and things will go back to what they were. This Biblical definition of forgiveness is very hard for most of us to swallow. How can you forget the unforgettable? How can you forgive the unforgivable? To enjoy the benefits of forgiveness, however, we needn't go that far. All that's really required is that we make the decision to move forward, to let go of the offense and the hurt and release the individual(s) from what they did. We don't have to condone what's been done. What's wrong is still wrong. We don't have to invite the person back into our lives or even become best of friends. What we must do is allow ourselves to release all the negative emotions associated with that person.

As long as we hold on to the pain and hurt, we are choosing to allow that person's past actions to continue to hurt us, therefore developing bitterness. We must choose to let go and stop allowing them to hurt us. This is an understanding of forgiveness that's more doable for those who feel they are less saintly.

I once read and made note that the inward component of forgiveness consists of enjoying the sense of emotional relief that comes when the burden of a grudge has melted away. The outer component involves extending one's attitude of goodwill and mercy outward to others.

Sometimes the public expression of forgiveness results in reconciliation whereby the relationship continues on as before. Sometimes it doesn't, and in certain cases it is inadvisable. But if I truly from my heart have forgiven them and released them, then I can move forward and experience as well as enjoy the benefits of God's forgiveness toward me.

That is what our relationship with God is all about.

The final attribute is obedience. Ananias enters the house where Saul is staying. He proclaims the message that God had given him, lays his hands on Saul and prays. Saul is healed, filled with the Holy Spirit, and baptized. Saul is now the Apostle Paul

As we strive to become the men God has called us to be, let us develop these same attributes we see in Ananias: a relationship where we recognize the voice of God, we share our thoughts and fears with Him, and we walk in obedience to His directions.

The English Language Institute-China had already accepted me to teach. In July we would travel to San Dimas, California, for three weeks of orientation. After that, on to our designated university in the People's Republic of China for the

1988-89 school year. I walked across the stage when they called my name, picking up the scroll of congratulations. Our diplomas would be mailed to us later. Dinner with friends and family celebrated this wonderful milestone.

One week later, I received a letter from the university, but it did not contain my diploma. Instead, a letter informing me that my 12 transfer credits from another university would not be accepted. I had not graduated after all.

What were we to do? As we prayed, the Lord reminded us that Jesus is the head of all rulers and authorities. I needed to trust in Him and appeal to the university authorities just as Daniel had made an appeal to the authority in charge of the Jewish captives' training and diet. So, I talked to my faculty advisor, and together we talked to the Dean of the English Department. The Dean stated that the only course of action would be for me to make an appeal to the vice-president of academic affairs. He was the only one who could bypass this university policy.

The night before my appointment, Debbie and I prayed that God would give me favor in the eyes of the vice-president. On the drive to the university, I prayed again and again, "Lord, give me favor." As I met with the vice-president, he assured me that the university's policy was to never accept credits from any "non-accredited" school unless there were extenuating circumstances. He listened politely as I explained my position. At the end of our meeting, he told me that he would send me a letter informing me of his decision. As I left, I prayed, "Lord, give me favor."

The following week, in the mailbox was a letter from the university. Sitting down together, Debbie and I opened the letter. "This correspondence is to inform you that the university has decided to accept your transfer credits. You have fulfilled all the requirements necessary to receive a Master's Degree in Teaching English as a Second Language. Your diploma is being sent to you under separate cover. Congratulations."

A second, greater celebration took place that evening. God was showing us that He really is the head of all rulers and authorities. He can direct the hearts of leaders where He wants them to go, even making exceptions when no exceptions are made. He was confirming His calling and direction for us at this time. This was God's will and nothing was going to stop His will. Two months later we were in China. God had fulfilled His promise.

Has God spoken to you about a direction or ministry? As you follow His leading, trust Him to bring His plan to completion in your life even when circumstances seem to oppose what you are doing. He will do it.



Towards the end of 1993, our family was growing to the point where we needed to buy our first house. My wife, Michelle, was convinced that renting was a waste and started looking for properties to buy. I was a little less motivated and reluctantly went through the motions of house shopping. We found a great little starter home and were soon sitting at the table for closing.

that since we were first time home buyers we only qualified for an Adjustable-Rate Mortgage (ARM) which meant that the rate of interest on our loan could go up or down 1 percentage point each year depending on the economy. While we didn't know much, we were smart enough to know that this could be devastating to our fledgling budget and dreams of owning a home. In a matter of several years, we could find ourselves in a real financial crunch. We looked at each other and clutched hands. What we DID know was that God is our complete provider. We had committed early on to make tithing a priority knowing full well that God would "...open the windows of heaven..." and that He would "...rebuke the devourer for our sakes....". After silently praying, we both signed on the line and took the keys to our new home.

Three times I was shipwrecked; a night and a day I was adrift at sea; on frequent journeys, in ... danger from robbers, danger from my own people ... danger in the city, danger in the wilderness, danger at sea ... in toil and hardship, through many a sleepless night, in hunger and thirst, often without food, in cold and exposure" (2 Corinthians 11:23-27). Paul's journey of faith ended in Mamertine prison in Rome where he was beheaded for his faith in Jesus Christ.

"Return home and tell how much God has done for you." Luke 8:39


